A two-day art exhibition by five women artists opens at Alliance Française de Delhi in Lodhi Estate on Friday.

Titled "Vicarious Pleasures — Why Not?", the group show features 30 abstract works in many different media including textiles and ceramic by Babita Gupta, Alka Raghuvanshi, Gauri Sahni, Manisha Gawade and Sangeeta Gupta.

Organised jointly by Mystiq Art Gallery and Art Spice, the exhibition captures the essence of existence. As the title suggests, the artists take cognisance of the vicarious lives we all lead in some ways.
